HIMAKROM METHODIST BASIC SCHOOL PROJECT

The village of Himakrom in the Western Region of Ghana is home to around 4,000 people. The local primary school, which includes a kindergarten, has very limited financial resources. As a result, not only were there inadequate school buildings, but there was also a lack of clean drinking water and hygienic toilets. The situation was especially critical for the 85 kindergarten children, who had to be taught outdoors due to the absence of a suitable building. This exposed them not only to the weather but also made concentrated learning difficult.

Due to the lack of toilets, students often had to relieve themselves outdoors, leading to serious hygiene issues. Diseases caused by poor hygiene resulted in high absenteeism.

To improve the children's educational opportunities, a project was launched to sustainably enhance the school's infrastructure. This included the construction of a fully equipped kindergarten building, the establishment of a computer room for digital education, the drilling and mechanization of a new borehole, and the construction of a toilet facility. The project was complemented by hygiene training to ensure better health conditions in the long term.

DZILAKORPE MA PRIMARY SCHOOL – A PATH TO EDUCATION AND THE FUTURE

On the remote island community of Dzilakorpe in Ghana's Oti Region, an important educational project is taking shape: the construction of the new Dzilakorpe MA Primary School, funded by the Reiner Meusch Foundation FLY & HELP. This project will provide over 350 children with the opportunity to learn in a safe environment for the first time, significantly improving the overall quality of life in the community.

The construction includes a modern school building with six classrooms, a teachers' room and a storage room, all equipped with new school furniture. A key focus is on water supply and hygiene: a mechanized water system will provide clean drinking water, and new sanitary facilities will ensure better hygiene conditions for students and teachers.

Since the location is difficult to access on an island, teacher accommodation is also being built to attract and support educators in the community and ensure long-term teaching stability. Additionally, hygiene and maintenance training will be conducted to raise awareness of healthy living conditions and ensure the sustainability of the infrastructure.





Construction began in June 2024. Thanks to the strong commitment of the local population, who assisted in transporting materials and producing bricks, significant progress has been made despite logistical challenges. Completion is expected in the second quarter of 2025. This project will provide children and teachers with a safe, learning-friendly environment that fosters better educational opportunities and future prospects.

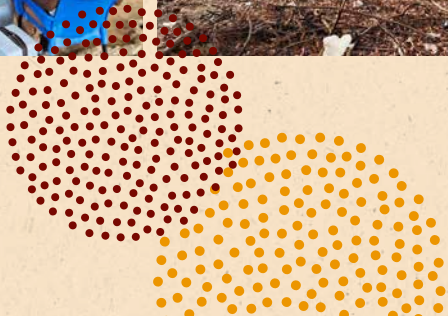

HOPE FOR A FORGOTTEN ISLAND COMMUNITY

In the remote island region of Dzilakorpe, there is not only a lack of a school, but the approximately 3,300 residents also have no access to healthcare. The island is virtually cut off from any development, and many children fall victim to child trafficking due to the lack of opportunities.

Madamfo Ghana is committed to sustainably improve living conditions in Dzilakorpe by constructing a CHPS compound. This center will provide much-needed medical care directly on-site, offer education on health and hygiene, and contribute to the long-term stability of the community.

Thanks to the donations of Jerome Evans and friends, the project was launched in December 2024. The foundation work has already been completed, and the first walls are erected. One of the biggest challenges is the transportation of building materials, as they can only be delivered by boat across Lake Volta. However, the project team has successfully overcome this logistical hurdle.

The healthcare center is scheduled for completion in June 2025. By then, the buildings will be fully constructed, medical equipment will be installed, and the center will be prepared for operation. Additionally, health programs will educate the population on hygiene and disease prevention. With this project, Dzilakorpe will receive its first-ever access to basic healthcare, offering a long-term perspective for a better future.

NEW SCHOOL BUILDING FOR EWUSIEJOE M/A GIRLS MODEL JUNIOR HIGH SCHOOL

For the students of Ewusiejoe Girls Model Junior High School, we have constructed a new, fully equipped school building featuring six classrooms, a teachers' room, a storage room, and a computer lab. Additionally, sanitary facilities and a mechanized water supply system have been provided.

This improved infrastructure benefits currently 434 students, ten teachers, and additional school staff. The school ensures that girls have continuous access to education and contributes to improving overall educational standards. Students now enjoy a better learning environment, access to clean drinking water, and hygienic sanitation facilities. This not only promotes health but also increases school attendance rates and enhances the quality of education.

To ensure long-term success, regular maintenance of the infrastructure as well as hygiene and health training are planned. In the future, additional facilities such as a library or specialized classrooms could further expand the educational opportunities.

This school construction project marks a significant step in promoting girls' education in Ghana and demonstrates how targeted investments can sustainably transform the future of young people.

RENOVATION OF THE ABOFFOUR KYEKYEWERE HEALTH CENTER

For a long time, the Aboffour Kyekyewere Health Center was in a dilapidated state, struggling to provide medical care for approximately 18,000 people from Kyekyewere and seven surrounding villages. The 40-year-old building was deteriorating, riddled with cracks, and barely offered protection against weather conditions. The few available rooms were overcrowded, forcing some patients to be treated on the floor.

There was a severe lack of essential medical equipment—many devices were outdated, unusable, or completely missing. The water supply was unreliable, and poor hygiene conditions contributed to the spread of diseases.

To drastically improve the situation, a comprehensive renovation and expansion was carried out. A new ward with 20 beds for women and children was built, while the old well was upgraded with a modern water system. Pumps, pipelines, and a storage tank now ensure a reliable water supply.

To guarantee the long-term functionality of the center, maintenance training and evaluation measures have been implemented. Additionally, regular awareness campaigns on hygiene, family planning, and maternal and child health are now conducted.
