At Lake Volta in Ghana, countless children fall victim to exploitation. Many come from extremely poor families, some even from neighbouring countries and are handed over by their relatives in the hope of a "better life" – to fishermen who force them to work under the harshest conditions.

Early in the morning, barefoot, unprotected, and often without enough food, they are made to pull nets from the water, fish, row and clean boats, or carry heavy loads. School, childhood and safety are far out of reach.

Thanks to the efforts of the responsible authorities and our partners, children are rescued – but what happens next?

THE CHILDREN'S SHELTER IN HO - A SAFE HAVEN AND PLACE OF REFUGE

Our Children's Shelter in Ho offers a new beginning for children affected by child trafficking on Lake Volta – a place of safety, stability, and care. In small, family-like groups, we can accommodate up to 90 children between the ages of 1 and 17.

But what we offer goes far beyond a roof over their heads:

Shelter & Living – Each child has their own bed – often for the first time – private spaces to retreat, and access to communal living and play areas.

Nutrition & Hygiene – Nutritious meals, with vegetables and wheat from our own farm, clean drinking water, personal hygiene, and fresh clothing are part of everyday life.

Education & Support – The children attend nearby schools, receive tutoring, and benefit from individual learning support. All school materials are provided.

Structure & Daily Life – Daily routines offer structure and stability: set mealtimes, learning sessions, playtime, and rest – crucial for children who have known little security.











We have a football field – sponsored by the BVB Foundation "leuchte auf" by our friend Atze Schröder – and a large playground for the younger children.

On weekends, we offer various activities such as sports, dance classes, and French lessons. Our in-house library invites children to read and relax, and our IT room provides a space for homework and learning.

This intensive care requires patience, expertise, and reliable support.




The documentary series SELFMADE on Prime Video features people who launch innovative companies and projects – without having great wealth to begin with.

A SCHOOL COMPLEX FOR APEDWA

In Akyem Apedwa, a small town in Ghana's Eastern Region with around 2,000 residents, over 250 children are currently taught in makeshift wooden shelters – without protection from rain or heat, without toilets, and without access to clean water. Girls are particularly affected, as there are no hygienic facilities for them during menstruation. As a result, illness, high absenteeism, and a lack of educational prospects are common.

To fundamentally change this situation, a comprehensive school project is being implemented in three phases – made possible through the support of the Reiner Meutsch Foundation FLY & HELP. A modern, inclusive school complex with a kindergarten, primary school, junior high school, borehole, toilet facilities, and computer equipment is being built.

Phase I includes the construction of a kindergarten with four classrooms, separate toilets for girls and boys, and the drilling of aborehole, with a mechanized water supply system. Hygiene training will raise awareness among children and staff, for sustainable health practices.

Phase 2 involves the construction of a primary school with six classrooms and a teacher's room, fully equipped with school furniture.







Phase 3 expands the educational offering with a junior high school consisting of three classrooms, an office, and a modern computer lab with workstations for 20 students.


The aim of the project is to provide all children in Apedwa with access to quality education, safe drinking water, and adequate hygiene facilities. This will lay the foundation for improved health, higher school attendance, and new future prospects – especially for girls.

THE SCHOOL PROJECT IN NYINAMPONASE:

STEP BY STEP TOWARD EDUCATION FOR AN ENTIRE VILLAGE

In the community of Nyinamponase in Ghana's Bono Region, more than 550 children are currently learning under unacceptable conditions. The three available classrooms are severely overcrowded, and some classes take place in a makeshift wooden structure without windows, doors, or a proper roof. There are no sanitary facilities at all – a particular challenge for girls during menstruation. The daily struggle to fetch water and find a suitable learning space leads to high absenteeism, school dropouts, child labor, and teenage pregnancies.

Thanks to the generous support of the Reiner Meutsch Foundation FLY & HELP, a new school complex is now being built in Nyinamponase: six classrooms, a teachers' office, storage room, hygienic toilet facilities, and a mechanized water supply system. In addition, students and teachers will receive training on hygiene and maintenance – ensuring long-term, sustainable use of the new infrastructure.

Construction began in March 2025 with a groundbreaking ceremony. The borehole has already been drilled and mechanized, the foundation is nearly complete, and wall construction is well underway. Completion is scheduled for October 2025. Even now, it's clear: a place of hope is being built – for education, health, and a better future.

With our project Sowing the Future, we are making a strong statement for climate and environmental protection in Northern Ghana – together with schools and local communities. The goal is to reforest dry areas in the long term while raising environmental awareness among young people.

In collaboration with local tree nurseries, we cultivate climate-resilient species such as mango, cashew, mahogany, neem, and acacia. These trees are planted on school grounds and community land – by students who are inspired through environmental education and hands-on sustainability workshops.

The schools themselves take responsibility for caring for the seedlings – supported by our awareness programs on hygiene, climate protection, and shared responsibility.

TO THE MOVIE















Since the start of the project, over 74,000 trees have already been planted – at dozens of schools across multiple regions in Northern Ghana.

Each tree stands for hope, a better future, and tangible climate action.

To ensure that the young trees can be watered even during the dry season, we equip the schools with solar-powered boreholes.

Sowing the Future is more than just a tree-planting project. It protects livelihoods, strengthens communities, and empowers children and young people to experience how their own actions can help make the world a greener place.














830 children attend the Agona Model School in Ghana's Western Region – but many of them don't have a place of their own to sit and learn.

Often, three or four students have to squeeze together on old, damaged benches that are far too small, wobbly, and uncomfortable. In such conditions, it's difficult to concentrate. Learning becomes a daily struggle.


We want to change that by providing IIO new, sturdy 2-in-I school benches – creating not only more space to learn, but also bringing dignity and motivation back into the classroom.

The benches are handcrafted by a local carpentry workshop, helping to boost the regional economy and create jobs in the community.

A SAFE SPACE FOR MOTHERS AND NEWBORNS IN NAMASA

For years, the only maternity clinic in the rural community of Namasa, located in Ghana's Bono Region, was little more than an improvised shelter: just one delivery bed, precariously stabilized with a stone, and no way to ensure hygienic births. Many women had no choice but to give birth at home – often without medical assistance and at great risk to themselves and their babies.

Thanks to the generous support of Wandern für die Andern e. V., the clinic has now been fully renovated and equipped with modern medical devices.

In addition, hygiene training sessions are being held to ensure safe and healthy births in the long term. The project not only improves maternal and neonatal healthcare but also strengthens women's trust in the local health system.

Today, the clinic is a place where mothers can give birth in dignity – safely and with professional care.
